



Hurricane Preparedness Kit

- Water - at least 1 gallon daily per person for 3 to 7 days
- Food - at least enough for 3 to 7 days: non-perishable packaged or canned food/juices, snack foods, non-electric can opener, cooking tools/fuel, disposable plates/utensils
- Towels, Blankets, Pillows, etc.
- Clothing - seasonal, rain gear, sturdy shoes
- First Aid Kit, Medicines, Prescription Drugs
- Special Items/Food—for babies and the elderly
- Toiletries, Hygiene items, Moisture wipes
- Flashlight & extra batteries
- Radio - Battery operated and NOAA weather radio
- Telephones—Fully charged cell phone with extra battery and a traditional (not cordless) telephone set, phone book
- Cash (with some small bills) & Credit Cards - Banks/ATMs may not be available for extended periods
- Keys—House, Car, Business, Safety Deposit Box, etc.
- Toys, Books and Games
- Important documents - in a waterproof container or watertight resealable plastic bag—insurance, medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card, etc.
- Tools - keep a set with you during the storm
- Vehicle fuel tanks filled
- Pet care items: proper identification, immunization records, medications, food and water, a carrier/cage and leash
